(Mike, cont.) daughter to abort after learning of a birth defect. This all happened in quick succession. Then the church bulletin listed an upcoming ministry fair where a TCRTL ad jumped out at me. I had to say to myself, 'He is trying to tell me something'. And I have been so happy to be part of this group." Since pro-life organizations are not funded by the federal government (like Planned Parenthood is to the tune of half a billion dollars per year), they rely more heavily on volunteers. "Mike has the ability to see clearly what needs to happen," said Theresa Giacalone, TCRTL President. "Upon learning of the recent challenge in the dismemberment ban, for example, his first reaction was, 'We've got to put a stop to this. What can we do?' Asking a question is where turning intent to action begins." Many have spent a near lifetime honing skills and experience that can be transferred to a new role defending life. Giacalone added. "Where a former career and heart for the pro-life cause intersect is a powerful place."
